Applications will be selected to create a diverse participant population from as many Hagerstown neighborhoods as possible. Applicants who are not selected for a particular session will be put on a waiting list with weighted consideration for future sessions. Applications received by February 26, 2010 will be given priority consideration; applications received after this date will be accepted as space is available.
